APPLAUSE IN CHURCH: Currently, the St. Paul worship experience favors exuberant involvement. We have, and are, constantly seeking an atmosphere of praise, joy, and excitement as opposed to the traditional stoic nature of the past. Hence, emotions involving, for example, such things as joy (laughter) and applause (praise/excitement) are normal, and appropriate in our worship services. However, lest anyone misinterpret applause for the choir, you've probably noticed the choir making an awkward departure from their singing presentation. This is to indicate that while applause is appreciated for their commitment and hard work, the congregational response is passed on to the cross by the choir turning and passing the praise on to Jesus. So far, the choir is attempting to get better at this (the choir has never presumed choreography as one of their fortes).

FOOD PANTRY ITEMS NEEDED: The North Tonawanda Inter-Church Food Pantry can always use donations. Some items to consider donating are: personal care products, cleaning supplies, canned fruit and meats, condiments, quick meals/side dishes (such as hamburger helper, tuna helper, rice a roni), pancake mix, syrup, cereal, jello, pudding, hot chocolate, coffee, tea bags and "fixins" for turkey dinner. MINISTRY OPPORTUNITY ("Ministry Meals") to serve our brothers and sisters in Christ. Do you enjoy cooking or baking for others? There is a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board at the top of the stairs for anyone that would be interested in making a meal or dessert for a family at St. Paul that might be experiencing a serious injury, a death, sickness, caring for a loved one in Hospice, or a recent surgery. When the office receives word of a church family who is currently experiencing one of the above and would like to receive help with meals, our coordinator will then contact one or more of you who have signed up to schedule the making and delivering of meals. USED CLOTHING SHEDS IN OUR AREA - As you drive around town, you may pass by other churches' parking lots hosting sheds designated for used clothing drop off. These sheds are owned by St. Pauly Textile in Rochester, who partner with local churches or community centers to collect used clothing. Donations are collected and used regionally, domestically and in international markets for textiles. Hosting sites also have "first dibs" on donations to distribute locally to people in need. St. Pauly pays hosting sites \$40 per 1,000lbs of clothing collected, which can easily amount to \$100-\$300 per month to a struggling church host site. Our elders looked into hosting a clothing shed here, but determined there are ample sheds in our community where the clothing and resultant funds can do much good. When you do your spring cleaning this year, consider your old clothing to go to one of these drop off sheds. St. Matthew, St. Mark and Redeemer Lutheran Churches all have sheds in their parking lots and would appreciate your donations.
